

PAISLEY.—THE LATE ESCAPADE FROM THE REFORMATORY.—Four of the boys who are supposed to have been the instigators of the late escapade from the Paisley Reformatory were yesterday, on pleading guilty, sentenced by Sheriff Fraser to sixty days' imprisonment, with hard labour, as an example to the others and to keep up the discipline of the institution.

INVERNESS—ANNUAL ROUP OF THE COMMON GOOD.—The yearly set of the common good of the Burgh of Inverness took place yesterday, with the following results :—The Petty Customs, put up at £1000, were after a keen competition knocked down to Mr Macleod, the present tenant, at £1300. The slaughter-house dues, put up at £150, were knocked down to Mr Alex. Bain, Tarbat, at £202. The last year's rent of Petty Customs was £1020 ; and of the slaughter-house dues, £182, 3s.
