
Continuity and Change

Children and Young Persons (Scotland) Act 1932

- Led to the re-designation of reformatory schools, and they became known as Approved Schools.
- Transfer of their administration from the Home Office to the Scottish Education Department signalled termination of the formal association between Reformatory/Industrial Schools and the prisons system.




Image of telegram sent to Kibble on its centenary in 1959

Social Work (Scotland) Act 1968

- Kibble became a 'List D' school in 1971, following implementation of this Act.
- A key feature of this transition was a shift in power, from Approved Schools' headmasters to the newly created Children's Hearings system.

- Kibble Education and Care Centre was formed in 1995, in response to local government reorganisation.
- April 1996 was the beginning of a new era for the school reclamation of its charitable mission and ethos being paralleled with its entry into the social market, as a social enterprise.
