The Interventions for Vulnerable Youth (IVY) Project is a national service that supports children and young people. As a service, IVY works with teams around you to help them understand more about you and the difficulties you may be facing. This helps to ensure you get the right support to help you move on with your life.

Sometimes, and if you want to, we will work directly with you to help you understand your behaviours and move forward to a positive, healthier future.

Who We Are

IVY is made up of a small team of social workers and psychologists who support young people, up to the age of nineteen, who have been involved in harmful behaviours towards others.

The aim of the service is to help young people and the teams around them to address their behaviours, develop positive relationships and prevent future harm.

As a national organisation, we can offer help and support to young people who live anywhere in Scotland. This is possible due to funding by the Scottish Government.

Ways We Can Support You

At IVY, we offer three levels of support:

Level 1: This is where we will meet with your team to learn more about your circumstances and why the difficulties might be happening.

Level 2: We will work alongside you to carry out different assessments in order to learn more about you and the best ways to support you.

Level 3: With this support, you will meet with a worker from the IVY team, get to know them better, and carry out focused work together.

IVY is a voluntary project which means that it is your choice or decision to access the service.

Building A Positive Future

Everyone makes mistakes, but it's important to understand why things happen and how to make better choices.

By getting support now, you can stop harmful behaviours, avoid future problems and build a positive future.

Who Can Access Support?

Anyone can access and refer to IVY if they work professionally with you.
